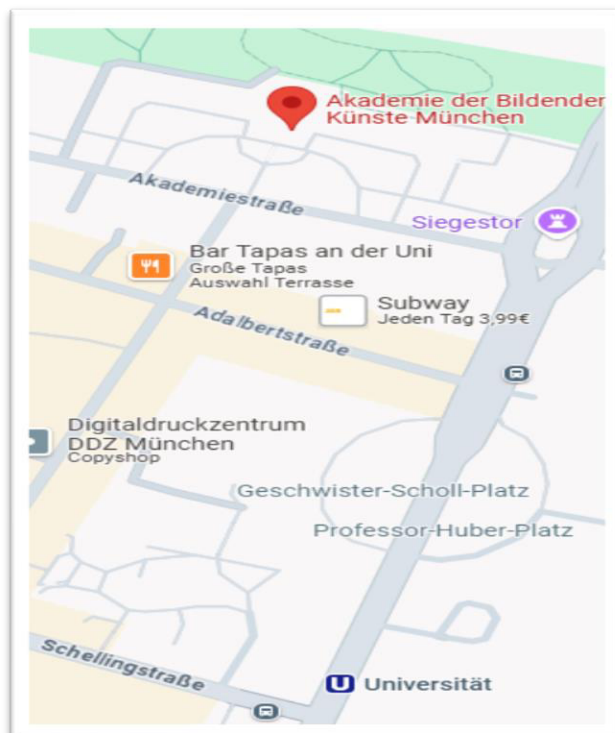


The Academy



Studying Fine Arts at the Academy is mainly organized in class associations. Overall, the Academy accommodates twenty-five Fine Arts classes, led by professors, who each stand for an individual approach to contemporary fine art. These classes are complemented by twenty study workshops and a

library, as well as seminars and lectures in art science, philosophy, and didactics. The workshops as well as seminars, guest lectures, and excursions are open to students of all disciplines. Approximately 800 students are currently enrolled at the Academy of Fine Arts in Munich. Each student is assigned to a class of his/her choice, selected during the admission process. Next to Fine Arts the Academy also offers study courses in Art Education, which is organized in classes as Fine Arts is, as well as Interior Architecture (Bachelor & Master), Architecture & Arts (Master only) & Therapy & Arts (Master only).

*The language of teaching is basically German. Depending on individual approaches of class professors and lecturers and their own native language there might be assistance in English or meetings in class held in English, but this is not obligatory. We highly recommend to speak both, German and English well.

Admission

In the middle of June a commission of professors & lecturers decides on the admission of Exchange students. A letter of acceptance will be mailed latest in the first week of July.



Enrolment

With the official letter of admission or acceptance, we will also send you enrolment documents, that need to be filled-out and sent back as soon as possible

Student Union Fee

Fees for the Studentenwerk Munich (Student Union Munich) must be paid by all students upon enrolment in Euros. The amount is set new each semester and for the summer term 2025 it is 85,00 € - there is no semester ticket for public transport included. Foreign currency transfers will not be accepted. Enrolment documents must include a confirmation of payment from your bank.

Enrolment – documents & details

After receiving your signed enrolment documents the Studierendensekretariat/ Students' service office sends a letter of enrolment (LRZ-Letter) with all necessary information. With this letter you will receive your access data for the IT services of the Academy of Fine Arts Munich as well as your student e-mail address and information on what you need to consider and the next steps.

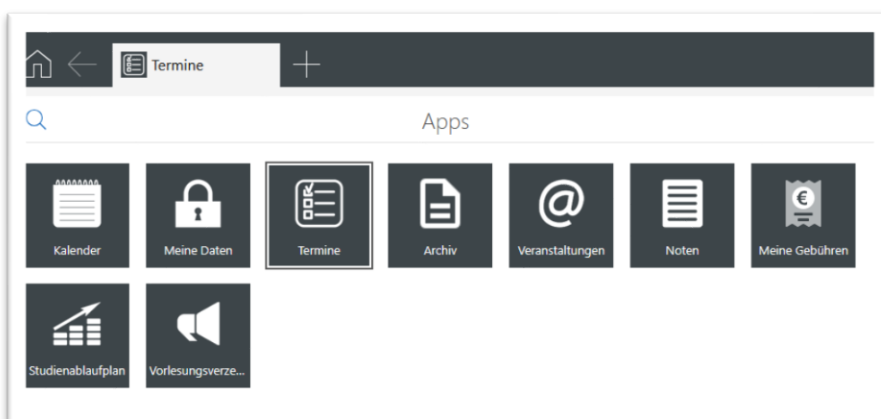

3. WLAN access (eduroam) with VPN login at the LRZ

In the student portal you will find

- the course catalogue (finalized approx. 4 weeks before semester starts) and you register for courses, lecturers and classes
- confirmations for courses, lecturers and classes at the end of the semester
- enter any changes of address
- print out certificates such as enrolment or fee certificates

There will be an online meeting or meetings in person in order to explain the registration process for your courses, lecturers and classes in MyCampus or you can contact the exchange tutors or the international office at any time.

Student ID Card

You will receive your student ID card on the welcome day. You can use this card in the mensa & library and for lowered fees in Museums and lowered fees for public transport etc.



Learning Agreement

The Academy of Fine Arts, Munich does not mandatory require that you do any ECTS - BUT your home universities might do so and they are the more important institutions regarding ECTS requirements. So please make sure to inform yourself at home about required minimum of ECTS for your stay abroad. As we publish the course catalogue about 4 weeks before semester starts and many students have to fill in the LA earlier, we recommend to fill in the Learning Agreement as follows:

Artistic work in class – 15 ECTS

Project work (in class or in one of the study workshops) – 5 ECTS

Study workshop – 2 ECTS

Please inform yourself very well about the ECTS the theory classes will bring – please also ask Theory/Philosophy/Art History professors and lecturers actively, if you need to hand in a seminar paper or if there are any other requirements to be fully credited.

Study Workshops

Basically, all workshops are available for all students of any study courses and study fields. The workshops and its machines can be used for free.

Material costs

If you need materials like clay, bronze or big amounts of inks, paper or color you will have to clarify the costs of your project in advance with the workshop lecturer. Many lecturers have recycled materials, small amount of test materials or basic amounts for free on stock, but please clarify this in detail in advance.

Workshop attendance

To attend a workshop, please contact the workshop lecturer in advance (with your official Munich student e-mail address) and ask for an appointment – you'll find all workshops here: <https://www.adbk.de/de/studium/lehrangebot/studienwerkstaetten.html> and register in MyCampus for the workshop as otherwise you cannot be credited for your achievements there.

Usually it is good to have a concept, project or research in mind, that you want to do while visiting the workshop. It would be best to give a short introduction to the work/idea you have in mind when contacting the workshop, the first time.

Some workshops want you to do a basic introduction – you will find information on that on the website or when you are contacting the workshop the first time. Please mention that you are doing an Erasmus or exchange semester, so lecturers are aware that you have limited time.

ECTS in study workshops

Basically, ECTS points for study workshops are awarded like follows (based on the fact that 1 ECTS is about 25-30 working hours):

2 ECTS are awarded per workshop for approx. 1.5 - 2 weeks of work*

5 ECTS are awarded for the "Project work" if it includes

a deeper examination of material and technology and if it leads to a finished or almost finished artwork – accordingly to a workload of about 125 - 150 working hours *

0.5 – 1 ECTS are individually awarded for time-limited introductions or special curricula offers made by individual workshops for individual semesters. You will find those offers within the course catalogue – cross-curricular offers – study workshops.

Some of the curricular offers might even be optional and not be awarded with any ECTS at all.

*Of course, you do not necessarily have to be present in the workshop the total number of working hours. Preliminary research, concepts for implementation, familiarization with techniques or software, etc. can also be counted as working time, but this assessment is of course left to the workshop lecturers.

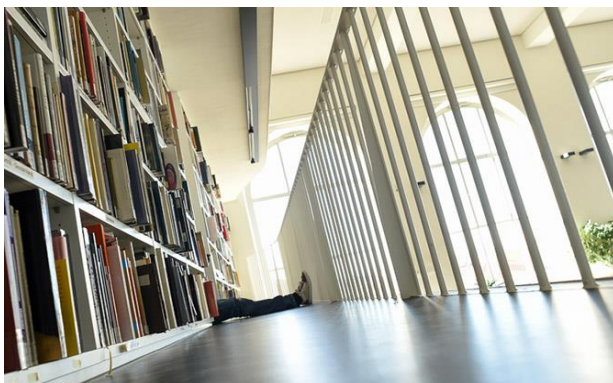

Payment

Food is billed by weight and costs between € 0.33 and € 0.75 per 100g. There are usually two main dishes (including vegetarian options) and a salad bar. All offerings can be customized.

CASH, DEBIT CARD, OR CREDIT CARD PAYMENTS ARE NOT ACCEPTED.

Payment is made with your student ID card. There is a reloading machine in the cafeteria that only accepts euro notes. The process is self-explanatory and just takes a little time. Please wait until the machine says "Thank you."

Accommodation

Accommodation via the Student Union

Via the Munich Student Union the Academy of Fine Arts Munich has very limited access to apartments for exchange students. When applying in the online form for an exchange semester you can also tick “I apply for a room in the student union” in the application form. About one fifth of incoming students gain accommodation via the student union. The rooms are about 15qm, 30 minutes by public transport from the academy and about 450 – 500 € per month.

You will receive information by the Academy, if you have gained a place there but all further documents by the Student Union and you will also have a contract with the Student Union not with the Academy for rental.

Please note that the Munich Student Union cannot take special requests for rooms (e.g. private bathrooms, distance to the Academy etc.) so it's up to you to decide if the room is a good fit. If you decide not to take the room, please inform the International Office and the Munich Student Union as soon as possible.

If there are any complaints regarding the room or apartment please inform us and the Student Union immediately.

Please do not apply directly at the Student Union for rooms, as exchange students can receive rooms and apartments only via their guest institution!



Searching for Private Accommodation

In general, please be aware, that accommodation in Munich is very hard to find and very expensive. Rooms are about 600,00 € -1.000,00 €/month depending on location, size and equipment. It is usual to pay caution in advance after a contract has been signed by all parties, but it is totally unusual to pay in advance for visiting the flat or receiving keys. Be aware of fraud!

Support by the International Office

The International Office offers to share your search with the academy's internal e-mail list. Please send us therefore a text that contains all relevant information about you, length of stay, cost limits and the allowance to share your mail address and information with the mailing list.

General Tips

- Get a head - start beginning to look well before the semester begins.
- Newspapers listings are still very useful. If you're buying the print edition, get it the evening before it officially appears, and call advertisers as soon as possible, but most newspapers also have an online version. Common newspapers are the Süddeutsche Zeitung <https://immobilienmarkt.sueddeutsche.de/> or the Münchner Wochenanzeiger <https://www.wochenanzeiger.de/mietangebote/>
- At the end of every semester, students are leaving Munich and looking for someone to take over their room / flat. You can therefore have a look at the Academy and other universities as the nearby LMU for notice boards, Student Facebook pages or mailing lists.
- Form groups and look for a larger place together to form your own WG. You may get connected during one of the Welcome events organized by the International Office, via social media, mailing lists or the notice boards.
- Advertised prices are usually basic rent, without utilities such as electricity, warm water, etc. This is called Kaltmiete. Rent that includes utilities is called Warmmiete.
- Expect to pay a deposit (Kaution) of one to three months basic rent.
- Be aware of flats advertised by agents. They charge a commission of up to 2 – 3 months basic rent.
- If you are looking for a whole flat, be aware that apartments don't always have a kitchen built in. Always ask questions to avoid surprises.
- If you don't immediately find the perfect place, accept a reasonable offer as a temporary solution, and then keep looking, especially if you're staying for more than one semester.

Mandatory Residence Registration

When moving to Munich to take up permanent residence – that is, if you stay for more than three months – you must register your address within two weeks of your arrival, otherwise you might have to pay a fine.

The Registration Form is filled out and signed by you and the landlord or owner of your accommodation.

You will receive a written confirmation of registration. This proof of registration is sometimes required by other institutions or authorities.

Working While Studying

In addition to the conditions of the Erasmus+ program, students from EU countries must consider the following when looking for work:

- Work a maximum of 70 days per calendar year
- Full-time employment is subject to tax – refundable at the end of the year
- The statutory minimum wage for 2025 is €12.82 per hour – a total of €556 per month for a maximum of 20 hours per week

Public transport: Semester ticket

If you want a semester ticket for public transport: Academy students must register with the MVG (MVG calls this M-Login) and verify their student status online. This happens automatically by logging in with your university ID (the same login details you use to log in to myCampus). Important: In this process, you must select your university from a long list of all Bavarian universities and will then be redirected to the login page. Since we operate the student status verification service (Shibboleth) jointly for several universities the Academy cannot be found; instead, you must select "Kunsthochschule Bayern." Unfortunately, this is not technically feasible. Please note that you must register via "Kunsthochschule Bayern."

Health Insurance, Medical Help & Emergencies

Insurance Certificate for Enrollment

For enrollment at a German university, it is required by law that you have health insurance and that you can prove this with a confirmation from a German health insurance company. A certificate of membership from your home insurance company in your home country or a copy of your health insurance card is not sufficient.

The certificate can be requested simply and easily via the Service Center under “Order certificate” at any German Health Insurance.

1. Students from other EU countries who have statutory health insurance in their home country require a form-based insurance certificate from a statutory health insurance company in Germany on presentation of the EHIC (European Health Insurance Card).
2. Students from non-EU/EEA countries with which Germany does not have a social security agreement must provide sufficient proof of insurance for Germany or take out student health insurance in Germany with a health insurance company. This is only necessary up to the age of 30. For the required proof of health insurance, students must contact a statutory German health insurance company.

Finding medical doctors

When looking for a doctor, it is important to know which health insurance you have.

Please note that private practices will bill you personally and not your health insurance. Private medical bills can be extremely expensive so it is always advisable to find out in advance whether your health insurance is recognized by the respective medical practice.

In Germany, there are general doctors (Hausärzte) who treat general illnesses (flu, headaches, abdominal pain, etc.) and, if necessary, refer you to a specialist. However, it is also possible to go directly to a specialist. e.g. dermatologist, gynecologist, orthopedist. Find a medical doctor or psychologist:

Medication

In Germany medicine is normally sold by pharmacies (Apotheken). The German Drug-dispensing laws are strict. Many medicines that may be prescription-free in your home country can only be purchased on prescription here (that you can receive by a doctor only).

The regular German health insurance will cover the costs of most prescribed drugs, but you may have to pay a prescription fee at the pharmacy. Please inform yourself very well in advance with your health insurance if you need regular medicines, how and where to organize this while staying abroad.

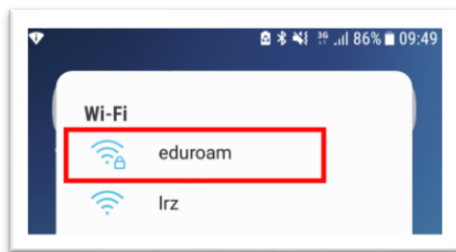


Internet at the Academy

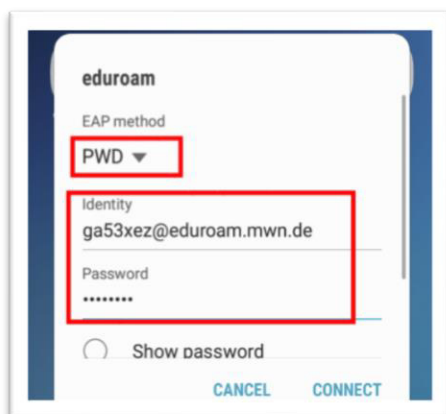
For internet access in the academy, you can use the WiFi provided by the Leibniz Supercomputing Centre (LRZ), called Eduroam, or the free BayernWLAN. Many classrooms have their own router as well – just ask other students for the login details.

Eduroam works not only at the Academy, but at the other universities in Munich (LMU, TUM etc.) as well. You will need your LRZ ID and the personal password you got at the beginning of the semester from the student office, which you also needed to log in to “mycampus” (your LRZ ID should start with adbk xxxx).

On your mobile phone, please follow these steps:



1) choose Wi-Fi, choose eduroam out of your list of Wi-Fis in order to connect to it



2) Enter user credentials. Please note that you don't have to enter your email address, but the LRZ ID starting with adbk xxxx and your password.

3) Connect to the Wi-Fi: After entering your user data, your device should automatically connect to the Wi-Fi. (Source: <https://wiki.tum.de/display/docs/Android+with+PWD>)

If you do not have an account for eduroam, you can use the open Wi-Fi BayernWLAN as an alternative. Login credentials are not required, just connect with the network "@BayernWLAN". Please keep in mind that this network connection is not encrypted.

State Opera / Sate Ballett Munich

As a student under 30 years of age, you can attend events in the U30 program at a standard price of €10. It pays to be quick, the contingent of seat tickets is limited. You can get tickets as early as one day after the start of telephone and counter sales. Standing tickets are generally discounted by 50% upon presentation of your student ID. Those who decide at the last minute can get hold of remaining tickets at the box office - if available - for 10€ each. If you can't get enough of the events of the State Opera/State Ballet, you can get the reduced monthly ticket for €25 instead of €50.

Philharmonie / Gasteig/ HP

Up to the age of 28, you can attend the concerts of Munich's Philharmonic Orchestra at a particularly low price. Tickets are available at the box office for €8.40 or €10.90 (subject to availability). Tickets are available via the webshop from 14 days after the start of advance sales for €9.40 or €12.40. Here, too, there is a limited contingent of tickets.

Münchner Volkstheater

Students up to the age of 30 pay €8.50 for a ticket in advance, and only €6 at the box office (if available). A particularly cool offer is also the subscription Jung ganz vorne (up to 27 years), which costs you a total of only 15€. This entitles you to follow three (self-) productions in the best (available) seats. By the way, a guided tour of the house is also included.

Cinema

In general, Tuesday is cinema day, i.e. there is a reduced admission to some cinemas. Others generally offer reduced admission. Please check the website of the cinemas. English movies or original films are available in almost all cinemas in Munich

Public Libraries, Museum, Sights

City Library

Everyone can visit the Munich Public Library and use it free of charge in person. You don't have to register or show identification. Only people who want to check out books, films, games, audio books etc. require their own account. The library at HP8 even allows checking out without any account.
